 Athletic Director, Biff Charlton reported that volleyball is off to a great start with two wins against Maricopa. Mrs. Fetterman has an enthusiastic group of fifteen players with only four seniors. They travel to a testing tournament Saturday Sept. 5th in Santa Barbara. Football has their first game Friday Sept. 9th against Faith Christian Academy from Coalinga. We will suit up 18 players this year with six seniors. The football carnival at Santa Maria, played on Aug. 29th, was our first contact game. As a team our goal is to win a sixth league championship in a row and once again to CIF playoffs. Basketball schedules are almost complete. We need to find a Girls Basketball coach which may be a challenge. Mike Wilson will be the boys coach this year.

VI. ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENT BODY REPORT(S):

A. Elementary School ASB Report

Elias Uribe, president of the ES ASB, reported that this years' officers are: Vice president – Monica Medina; Secretary – Kenneth Caballero and Treasurer – Kristy Searcy. The Class representatives are Felipe Garcia, Jose Angel Sanchez, and Maddie Tidd. We have had a jersey day and are planning many more events, including a talent show. The students at the Elementary School are looking forward to a great school year.

VII. BOARD REPORT(S):

Ms. Tamra Cloud discussed the district's presence at the October Cuyama reunion on October 17th and 18th. The board encourages everyone to participate in the reunion.

VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Dr. Chounet spoke about the CALPADS data management recognition. Dr. Chounet reviewed the IT network manager issues between Limotta and CJUSD. He states that the level of services are lower than what he desires. Dr. Chounet discussed possibly working with a new network service company, Diamond IT. Dr. Chounet asked Mr. Juan Gonzalez if he had any information on comparable costs for network service in other districts. If we were to shift service companies, we definitely do not want to do it in the middle of a school year. We received a letter of approval from the county for our LCAP. Ms. Ellen Barter at SBCEO wants to use our LCAP as an example for the districts. Our LCAP plan is very clean and simple along with being very usable. Dr. Chounet was contacted by UC Santa Barbara, who has been working with Gene Zannon and the Blue Sky Sustainable Living Center. They want to partner with CJUSD and put a "SMART Farm Demo" on our school sites. This would be a great opportunity for our students to see Ag research being done right here in Cuyama at their schools. Duncan Family Farms would also like to partner in this program. The Board agrees that Dr. Chounet should continue pursuing this project. Mr. Greg Beard informed CJUSD that they received a Partner Trust Grant, "Pathways in

AG". The High School currently has two pathways, and we are in the process of developing a third. This will coordinate with the "SMART Farm Demo". This Ag research project will not take time away from our teacher's daily schedules. Blue Sky Sustainable Living Center has a website with more information available, if you are interested. The District had our facilities assessment completed, with eye-opening results. Dr. Chounet asked the Board if they are interested in having him look into Bond Measures to start tackling some of the needs for the facilities. The district cannot get a hardship grant unless we have failed to pass a Bond twice. Mr. Mike Mann stated that CJUSD has a very good bond rating, and thinks it is definitely something we need to look into. Dr. Chounet knows people who will come talk to us about the process. He will pursue this issue further. A young woman valley resident passed away in a vehicle accident on Tuesday, impacting the students. The district asked the school psychologist to come and talk directly to close relatives and students about the episode. The psychologist will be back next Thursday to address the needs of the students affected.
